# Interpretative Phenomenological Analysis (IPA)

A qualitative research approach that focuses on exploring how individuals make sense of their lived experiences.

#### Involves:

- Detailed, in-depth exploration of individual experiences.
- •Interpretation by both the participant and researcher recognising that meaning is co-constructed.
- •A small, purposive sample, allowing for deep, rich analysis.
- •An idiographic approach which prioritises individual experience before looking for broader patterns.
